



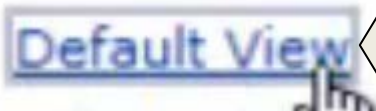
Submission Views in Quizzes

In this tutorial we will learn about submission views in the quizzes section.

Step 1. Setting up the View for Quizzes



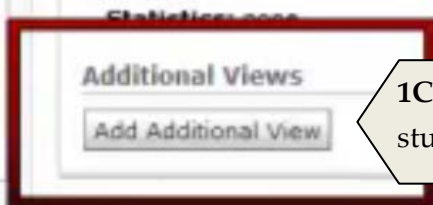
1A. Go to the submission views tab.



1B. On this tab you will see that the default view is used for students. The default view is what students will see right after they have submitted their quiz. If you would like to modify the default view click on the blue link entitled default view.




We recommend you to keep the settings as is. The default settings of the default view will only show the date they submitted the exam, the attempt score and overall attempt. Changing the settings of the default view may allow students to see their answers before the deadline of the exam and potentially share the answers with others.




1C. If you would like to provide an answer key for your students please click the add additional view button.

1E. Then you can add a message that is shown when the submission view is viewed.

1F. You can set the start date of the submission view, we recommend you to choose a date after the deadline of the quiz.

1G. Depending on the attempt settings, the restrictions settings may have additional fields. For instance you may have an attempt section where you need to specify the submission view of a particular attempt. You may also have a min/max score percent section where the submission view will be released if the received score falls into the min/max range.

Step 2. Specifying Details for Quizzes

The next section allows you to specify the details of the quiz. The first part of specifying details is deciding whether or not to show the questions of the quiz when the submission view is viewed.

2A. Currently, a student is not able to see the questions but you can change that by selecting the yes radio button.

2B. When you do this new sub-options will be available to specify which questions you want shown. You can show only the questions that were answered incorrectly or correctly or you can show all questions with or without user responses.

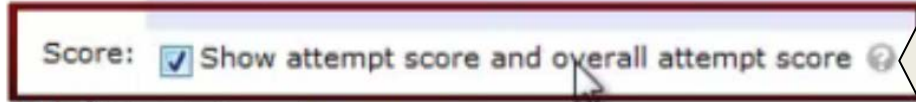
2C. The students will not be able to see the corresponding correct answers and the scores unless you check the boxes below.

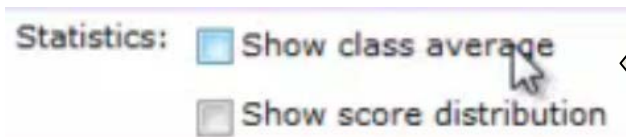
2D. The system is designed in a way that the students won't be able to predict the correct or incorrect answer unless you choose show question answers. The first two options will show the questions that students won't be able to predict the correct answers just by looking at the question.

For example, choosing show questions incorrectly or correctly will not display true/false questions because if it is showing an incorrect answer, the student will know the correct answer. Another example is if a student is allowed multiple attempts and they answer a multiple choice answer incorrectly, they will see that it is incorrect but they won't see the answer unless the show question answers box is checked. So when they attempt the quiz again they will not know the right answer, they will just know that the previous answer was wrong.




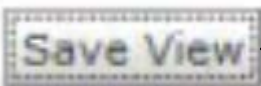
2E. The next check box pertains to the showing the score. Users will be able to see their score as soon as the submission view is viewed.

The score that is displayed is only what the system can auto-grade. This option is different from the question score because it shows the score of the overall attempt of the quiz rather than the score of each question.




2F. The next section will allow you to show the class average or score distribution. Check the corresponding boxes to show the statistics you want.

 We recommend you not to click these boxes if you have concerns about those who may complain about their grade after seeing other scores. These buttons are useful if you are using a bell curve for grading and if you would like to inform your students about their performance and standing in the class.



2G. Now click save view.
